April

- Apr. 1—Quebec—Easter Monday stat holiday
- Apr. 1—Federal—Minimum wage increases 65 cents to \$17.30 per hour or the provincial/territorial rate, whichever is higher
- Apr. 1-New Brunswick-Minimum wage increases 55 cents to \$15.30 per hour
- Apr. 1-Newfoundland-Minimum wage increases 60 cents to \$15.60 per hour
- Apr. 1-Nova Scotia-Minimum wage increases 20 cents to \$15.20 per hour
- Apr. 1—Nunavut—Residency allowance for public employees increases from \$400 to \$1,000 per month
- Apr. 1—Prince Edward Island—Minimum wage increases 40 cents to \$15.40 per hour
- Apr. 1-Yukon-Minimum wage increases from \$16.77 to \$17.59 per hour
- Apr. 3—New Brunswick—End of public comments on proposed changes to OHS regulations
- Apr. 25—Northwest Territories—End of surveying on mental wellness and recovery services

May

- May 1—National—End of temporary rule changes to Temporary Foreign Workers Program
- May 1-Quebec-Minimum wage increases 50 cents to \$15.75 per hour
- May 20-Alberta/BC/Manitoba/Ontario/All 3 Territories-Victoria Day stat holiday

May 20-Quebec-Patriots' Day stat holiday

June

June 1—BC—Minimum wage increases 65 cents to \$17.40 per hour

June 4—Federal—Changes to Hours of Work Regulations for air transportation employees take effect

June 21—Northwest Territories/Yukon—National Indigenous Peoples Day stat holiday

June 24—Quebec—Ste. Jean Baptiste Day stat holiday

June 30—New Brunswick—Deadline for workers to apply for one-time \$300 N.B. Workers Benefit

June 30—New Brunswick—Deadline for Job Creation Partnerships program funding applications
