Ontario's Minimum Wage Increases To Keep Up With Inflation



On October 1, 2015, the general minimum wage rate in Ontario will increase to C\$11.25 per hour from C\$11 per hour. Minimum wage rates for students, liquor servers, homeworkers and hunting/fishing guides will also increase on that day.

This increase is due to recent amendments to the Ontario *Employment Standards* Act, 2000 that link minimum wage rates to inflation. Each year, the government will calculate the necessary minimum wage adjustment based on the Consumer Price Index in Ontario. If the calculation results in an increase to the minimum wage, such increase will be announced on or before April 1 and come into effect on October 1 of the same year. If the calculation results in a decrease to the minimum wage, no adjustment will be made.
